## **"I Will" (Punctuality – part 3)**

### **1. Be at the right place at the right time.**

Being at the right place at the wrong time doesn't bring success. What message does it send when you arrive late or unprepared? What sacrifices do you sometimes have to make in order to be in the right place at the right time?

### **2. Plan for unexpected delays.**

Things take longer than anticipated. A punctual person builds extra time into the schedule. Why is it important to plan for delays? What unexpected things do you have to deal with at school or at home?

### **3. Do my work ahead of time.**

Each assignment is like a race. Just as winning runners don't wait at the starting line after the race begins, successful students and parents don't postpone beginning their projects. By dividing tasks into small goals and setting deadlines, they can see progress. How much better is your work when you give yourself enough time to do it? Pick a project that you have to do today, prioritize, and create a plan to move forward.

### **4. Make a daily schedule and keep it.**

Time and money have much in common. Both can be spent, both can be invested. When you make a schedule, it is essential to not get distracted by the unimportant things that will steal your time. How should you prioritize assignments, work, and tasks you have to do at home? When is appropriate to adjust and change your schedule?

### **5. Think of the impact on others.**

A machine runs most efficiently when individual gears fit together precisely. When one gear loses synchronization with the others, it affects the whole machine. In the same way, students out of sync with others in the class put an increased strain on the whole system.
