The 5<sup>th</sup> and 6<sup>th</sup> grade class went to Redding to the Schreder Planetarium in March. The planetarium is a building which houses an instrument for projecting images of the stars, constellation groups and their locations, planets and other astronomical phenomena onto a domed ceiling. Students were able to identify some of the most common constellations such as the Big and Little Dipper and the North Star. We also learned how there are ongoing plans for NASA to investigate the possibilities of visiting Mars. The students had the chance to hear a presentation about the way rockets worked and how they are navigated in space. Soon we will be building our own individual rockets and launching them right here at OCS!

In addition to seeing heavenly bodies on the ceiling of the domed theater, students were able to go to stations with hands on activities. One station had a projection of the geography of the earth and the students were able to put their hands and arms into the projection, pretty cool looking, don't you think?

This station had a sand table and the students could make landforms and the colored light above sensed the elevation and colored the landforms appropriately. The higher the elevations were warm colors, and the lower elevations were cool colors.
