#### **GIRLS**

Bottoms: Navy or Khaki. Hemmed, well-fitted, neat and without holes

Shorts- Should be finger-tip length or longer.

Skorts/Jumpers/Skirts /Dresses- **No higher than 4 " above bended knee length** (mandatory that shorts be worn under dresses, jumpers, and skirts.)

Tops: Red, White, or Navy Blue solid color, with a collar and at least two buttons, long or short sleeved. Must cover the stomach when arms are raised.

No make-up will be allowed at school or school activities

No tattoos, permanent or temporary.

Chapel Dress:

Bottoms - No cargos, shorts, or capris

Tops - Follow Tops uniform dress code.

No hooded sweatshirts.

#### **BOYS**

Bottoms: Navy or Khaki. Hemmed, well-fitted, neat and without holes

Shorts - Finger-tip length or longer.

Tops: Red, White, or Navy Blue solid color, with a collar and at least two buttons, long or short sleeved. All shirts must be tucked in at all times.

Ties must reflect positive, wholesome, Christian standards.

Ties may be worn any day and are encouraged to be worn on Chapel days.

Hair styles should not extend lower than the eyebrows, nor hang over the shirt collar, or extend lower than the mid-ear.

Students' hair coloring should be natural. No extreme styles (numbers, ridges, Mohawks, etc.).

Earrings are not allowed.

No tattoos, permanent or temporary.

Chapel Dress:

Bottoms - No cargos, shorts, or athletic pants.

Tops - White, Navy, or Red dress shirts may be worn for chapel instead of the Navy or Red polos.

Ties are encouraged but not required.

No hooded sweatshirts.
