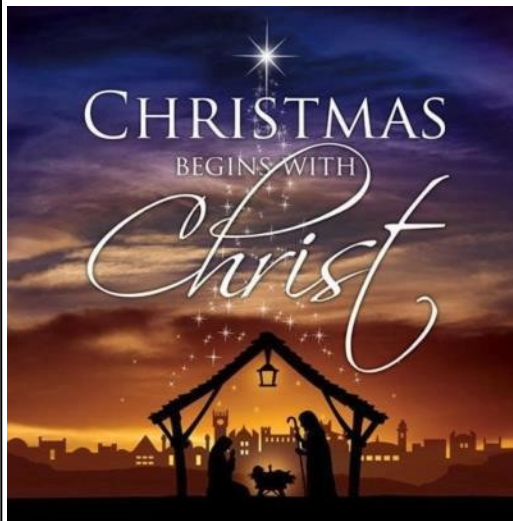

I am so touched at the excitement the kindergarten students have in getting ready for their Christmas play. They have complete acceptance of the truth of God’s word.

They simply trust what they hear about the Baby Jesus in the manger. They believe the Biblical account of shepherds, wise men, and angels going to worship the Christ child.

Students are anticipating the celebration of Christ’s birth with family, and can hardly wait! They are in a hurry!
