OCS has a Philosophy (Biblical Worldview Objectives)

The educational philosophy of Oroville Christian School is a God-centered biblical worldview that all truth is God's truth, and that the Bible is the inspired and only infallible authoritative Word of God, which contains this truth. God created all things and sustains all things. Therefore, the universe and man are dynamically related to God and have the purpose of glorifying Him. Man is a sinner by nature and therefore cannot glorify or know God except that the Holy Spirit draws man to salvation through His Son, Jesus Christ.

Our aim socially is to provide a Christian perspective on the total worldview from which will come a balanced understanding and acceptance of a person's role in life at home, at work, at play and at worship—all grounded in biblical truth. Our energies and resources promote high academic standards while helping students achieve creative and critical thinking skills. Our responsibility for the student encompasses the spiritual, mental, intellectual, physical, social and emotional areas, all of which are inseparable and through which run the thread of spirituality. Thus, we will not teach the Bible compartmentally or on the intellectual level alone. A biblical worldview is woven throughout the total curriculum.

The types of activities we employ or permit in the classroom or school program must support our basic philosophy. We strive to cooperate closely with parents in every phase of a student's development, always offering assistance in understanding the purposes of OCS. The following objectives are established to assist in implementation of our philosophy.

A. To teach that the Bible is the inspired and the only infallible authoritative Word of God, thus developing attitudes of love and respect toward it (2 Timothy 3:15-17; 2 Peter 1:20-21)

B. To provide opportunities for the student to confess Jesus Christ as Savior and Lord (Romans 10:9, 20)

C. To teach biblical character qualities and provide opportunities for the student to demonstrate these qualities (1 Samuel 16:7; Galatians 5:22-23)

D. To teach the student how to develop the mind of Christ toward godliness (Philippians 2:5; 1 Timothy 4:7)

E. To encourage the student to develop self-discipline and responsibility from God's perspective (1 Timothy 4:7; 1 Corinthians 9:24-27)

F. To teach the student the respect for and submission to authority from God's perspective Romans 13:1-7; Hebrews 13:17; Ephesians 6:1-3)

G. To help the student develop a Christian world view by integrating life and all studies with the Bible (2 Peter 1:3)

H. To teach the student to hide God's Word in his heart through memorization and meditation (Psalm 119:11; Psalm 1:103)

I. To help the student develop his identity in Christ as a unique individual created in the image of God and to attain his fullest potential (Psalm 139:13-161)

J. To teach the student to treat everyone with love and respect as unique individuals created in God's image (Philippians 2:1-4; Ephesians 5:21)

K. To teach the student how to become a contributing member of his society by realizing his need to serve others (Galatians 5:13; Romans 2:10)

L. To teach the student physical fitness, good health habits, and wise use of the body as the temple of God (1 Corinthians 6:19-20)

M. To teach the student biblical attitudes toward material things and his responsibility for using them for God's glory (1 Timothy 6:17-19; Matthew 6:19-20; 1 Corinthians 10:31)

N. To teach the student to understand and use the fundamental processes in communicating and dealing with others (2 Corinthians 5:20)

O. To teach and encourage the student to use good study skills and habits (2 Timothy 2:3-7)

P. To teach the student how to research and to reason logically from a biblical perspective (Hebrews 5:14; Romans 12:2)

Q. To teach the student good citizenship through an understanding and appreciation of our Christian and American heritages (1 Corinthians 10:11; Romans 13:1-7)

R. To cooperate closely as servants with the parents in every phase of the student's development, especially as it relates to the school program (Mark 10: 45)

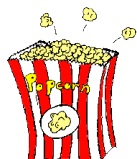

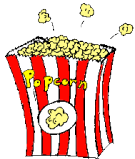
